


PCC Bibliographic RDA Training in Special Formats Survey Results

The PCC Secretariat conducted a survey to the PCC BIBCList listserv about the need for bibliographic RDA training in special formats in the fall 2014. The survey was part of the follow-up from the PCC Training Meeting of ALA Annual in June 2014. Below are the detailed survey results and analyzed responses.

Survey results:

Analyzed responses:

Total of 48 responses were received. Participants were asked to rank among eight formats included in the PCC RDA BSR Metadata Application Profile document. More than half of the survey participants expressed interest in receiving training support in the following five areas: moving images, audio recordings, electronic resources (computer file format), cartographic resources, and rare materials (books, graphics, and notated music). The following three areas of notated music, archival materials, and graphic materials received less interest comparing to the other five categories. The PCC Steering Committee on Training (SCT) has been tasked to work on the training materials and conduct training based on the survey results.
