

## Non-Literary Compilations G 180

**DEFINITION:** *Non-literary compilations are collections or selections of nonfiction (i.e., non-literary) works of an author and are entered under an RDA conventional collective title.*

*Example:*

```
100 1# $a Prontera, Francesco.  
240 10 $a Essays. $k Selections

*This instruction sheet provides guidelines for the shelflisting of non-literary compilations. For instructions on the subarrangement of compilations by literary authors, see F633.*

**1. General rule.** Unless the schedule has specific instructions to the contrary, follow the preferred shelflist order (cf. G 65).

**2. Subarrangement of collections and selections.** Assign a single Cutter number to all collections. Also assign a single successive Cutter number to all selections. Subarrange collections and selections by the date of publication, and a work letter if necessary (cf. G 140).

**3. Hypothetical example.**
