

Addresses, Essays, Lectures H 1210

BACKGROUND: *Until early 1986, the subdivision –Addresses, essays, lectures was used as a form subdivision to distinguish works that consist of collected papers, miscellaneous articles, anthologies of readings, etc., from works that consist of continuous text. Because this distinction was determined not to be sufficiently useful, the subdivision was discontinued. References to the subdivision were removed from the subject authority file. For classification of addresses, essays, and lectures, see F 300.*

1. General rule. Do not use the subdivision –**Addresses, essays, lectures** under headings assigned to any new work being cataloged. To any work that would formerly have been assigned this subdivision, assign the appropriate headings with no form subdivision.

LC practice:

2. Bibliographic file maintenance.

a. General. Do not make any systematic attempt to correct the subdivision on existing bibliographic records. However, if the subject headings on an individual record are being revised or updated for other reasons, delete –**Addresses, essays, lectures** whenever it is encountered.

b. Editions. If a new edition of a work is being cataloged, earlier editions of which have been assigned headings with the subdivision –**Addresses, essays, lectures**, update MARC records of the earlier editions so that the 6XX fields in the records for all editions match.
