GrayLIT Network

(Available through MSFRIC's databases)

Gray literature is defined as "foreign or domestic open source material that usually is available through specialized channels and may not enter normal channels or systems of publication, distribution, bibliographic control, or acquisition by booksellers or subscription agents."

The **GrayLIT Network** makes the gray literature of the US Federal Agencies easily accessible over the Internet. It taps into the search engines of distributed gray literature collections, enabling the user to find information without first having to know the sponsoring agency.

Flag Day, June 14th

In the United States, Flag Day (more formally, National Flag Day), is celebrated on June 14. It commemorates the adoption of the flag of the United States, which happened that day by resolution of the Second Continental Congress in 1777.

In 1916, Woodrow Wilson

issued a proclamation that officially established June 14 as Flag Day, in August 1949; an Act of Congress established National Flag Day.

Flag Day is not an official federal holiday, though on June 14, 1937, Pennsylvania became the first (and only) US state to celebrate Flag Day

as a state holiday.

Title 36 Sec. 110 of the US Code is the official statute on Flag Day; however, it is at the President's discretion to proclaim officially the observance.
