Academic Search Premier

(Available through MSFRIC's databases)

This multi-disciplinary database provides full text for nearly 4,500 journals, including full text for more than 3,600 peer-reviewed titles. PDF backfiles to 1975 or further are available for well over one hundred journals, and searchable cited references are provided for 1,000 titles. *Academic Search Premier* is updated on a daily basis by EBSCOhost.

Regional Business News

This database provides comprehensive full text coverage for regional business publications. It incorporates coverage of 75 business journals, newspapers, and newswires from all metro and rural areas within the US. Its is updated daily.

Number of places nationwide with "liberty" in its name—30. The most populous one is Liberty, MO (29,042). Iowa, with four, has more of these places than any other state: Libertyville, New Liberty, North Liberty, and West Liberty. Thirty-two places are named "eagle" - after the majestic bird that serves as our

national symbol. The most populous such place is Eagle Pass, TX, with 25,571 residents. There is also Eagle County, CO, with a population of 49,085. Eleven places have "independence" in their name. The most populous of these is Independence, MO, with 110,208 residents. There is one place named "patriot" - Patriot, IN, with a population

of 195. And what could be more fitting than spending the Fourth of July in a place called "America"?
