As part of a series of orientations to libraries and information centers, FLICC is offering an opportunity for federal librarians to become acquainted with the Ralph J. Bunche Library at the Department of State.

Established in 1789 by the first Secretary of State, Thomas Jefferson, the Bunche Library is the oldest official federal library. The library houses a large and unique collection of unclassified and published information sources on foreign relations. Now serving nearly 40,000 State Department employees, the library's staff and collection support U.S. diplomatic efforts worldwide. The morning will feature an overview of the Bunche Library, its resources and services and a tour of the facility.

On the day of the event, all federal government attendees must bring government photo IDs to obtain a badge from the Security Office.
