The L'Enfant Plaza Metro Station (Blue/Orange/Silver/Green/Yellow lines) and has direct indoor access to the IMLS office. Upon exiting your train, follow signs that say "L'Enfant Plaza, D & 9th streets." The correct exit has a picture of a dog in an astronaut suit with a white background. Take the escalators to the top (there will be a Starbucks on your right). Go straight through the glass doors into the food court.
