INTRODUCTION

Foundation Grants for Preservation in Libraries, Archives, and Museums lists 1,944 grants of \$5,000 or more awarded by 488 grantmakers, from 2004 through the publication date of this guide. It covers grants to public, academic, research, school, and special libraries, and to archives and museums for activities related to conservation and preservation. Preservation grant funding described includes archives conservation, art conservation, collections management, computer systems development, disaster funding, education, electronic media and online services, endowments, environment, equipment, exhibit preservation and treatment, faculty and staff development, fellowships and internships, film and video preservation, global programs, governmental programs and needs, higher education, historical and archaeological preservation, historical societies, international exchanges, library preservation, museum preservation, painting conservation, performing arts preservation, photography preservation, program evaluations, publications, research, scholarship funds, science, social science, telecommunications, university, and visual arts conservation among others.

This *Guide* is derived from a grants database of more than 20,000 grantmakers, which includes the grants from more than 1,000 of the largest foundations including the top 15 funders in each state, as well as sample grants from a wide range of small and medium-sized funders. The grants listed in this publication are also included in the *Foundation Directory Online*, the Foundation Center's subscription-based service, along with detailed profiles of the foundations making the grants

ARRANGEMENT

Within this volume, grants are arranged alphabetically by state, then by foundation name and recipient name within each foundation listing. Grant records include the following information: the name, city, and location (state or foreign country) of the recipient organization; the amount awarded; the fiscal year of grant authorization (or payment); and a description of the activity funded. Numeric references in the indexes

are to grant identification numbers, *not* page numbers.

Access to the grants is available through three indexes:

- ◆ an index of recipient names;
- ◆ a geographic index (arranged by recipient state or foreign country location, then recipient name); and
- ◆ an index of subject key words.

The subject index contains a number of multiple index terms, such as film/video, that are indexed under the first word in the term, in this case, film. If you are using the online version of this publication, and you cannot find what you are looking for in the subject index, you can also search for your subject term using the “find in” search feature. Type the Control and F keys to open the “find in” search feature, then type any word(s), such as video.

RESEARCH USING THIS GUIDE

In developing your basic list of potential funding sources, you should scan the grant listings in the category or categories closest to your field. Depending on the nature of your search, you will add to your list of possibilities the names of those foundations whose recent grants seem to indicate a potential interest in your organization or project. You should be looking for foundations that have funded an organization or project like yours, that are located or seem to award grants in your geographic area, and/or that have made grants in dollar amounts similar to the amount you are seeking.

If you are new to grantseeking research, we recommend that you visit the *Get Started* area of the Foundation Center's [web site](http://foundationcenter.org) (foundationcenter.org). Continuously updated, the Foundation Center's web site is visited daily by tens of thousands of grantseekers, grantmakers, and others interested in the world of philanthropy. PLEASE REMEMBER: IF YOU DO NOT QUALIFY, DO NOT APPLY.

Comprehensive research using all available resources will help the grantseeker determine the overall giving interests of a particular foundation and decide on appropriate foundations to apply to for funding. It is essential to remember that many foundations place limitations on their giving, including by subject area, recipient type, and geographic location. Finding out about any limitations before submitting grant proposals will save you time, decrease the number of rejections you receive, and demonstrate to the foundations you target that you know your field. The restrictions to giving under which some foundations operate appear in two places in this volume: in the "Grant Listings" section and in the "List of Foundations" section. If you do not fall within a funder's giving guidelines, do not apply for a grant. For *all* foundations, however, it is vitally important that you do further research before applying for funding.

After developing a list of foundations with a funding history in your field, it is imperative that you learn more about each one by consulting additional reference sources. If you are using the online version of this publication, you can start by clicking on the foundation name that is found at the beginning of each funder's list of grants. This link will take you to the funder's record in [Foundation Finder](http://Inp.foundationcenter.org/finder.html) (Inp.foundationcenter.org/finder.html), at the Foundation Center's web site. Here you will find the latest contact information, brief financial data, a link to the funder's web site (if available), and a link to the funder's latest IRS Forms 990-PF. For more information about a foundation, use the Foundation Center's [Foundation Directory Online](http://fconline.fdncenter.org) (fconline.fdncenter.org), or the print *Foundation Directory*.
