Dear Mr. Mc Dougle:

This letter will confirm the conversations which Mr. Jack Delano and I have been having with your office concerning his proposed trip to do a story on transportation in the West.

We would like to emphasize at this time the part the railroads are playing in the war effort of this country. Mr. Delano's itinerary, as we have worked it out, will give first consideration to the moving of materials. He will want to start the job in Chicago. This seems to us the logical place to get the feeling of the multiplicity of railroad facilities. After he had worked here for a couple of weeks, he would then like to take a freight train to the West Coast, probably over a northern route, getting something of the drama and flavor of the "freight train"; a more leisurely trip along down the Pacific Coast; and a series of short trips by freight or passenger from the West Coast back to Chicago. On the jump from the coast back again, we hope he will have an opportunity to change trains and pick up all the types of things that are loaded onto cars — materials, people, etc.; also to get something of the feeling of the little towns and the larger cities through which the train runs. Mr. Delano is preparing a written detailed outline of the proposed itinerary which we have worked out.

I know this is a pretty broad assignment, and as usual, we will probably fall somewhat behind accomplishing all that we now have in mind. We would appreciate no end any assistance which the Association of American Railroads can give us in arranging these schedules, getting clearance for us with the railroads who can best fit into such a schedule. We will, of course, get the approval of the Army and the Federal Bureau of Investigation on this venture.

We wish to thank you for all the courtesies which you have extended to us.
