The Great Seal of the State of California.

Adopted September 29th, 1849, by the Convention which framed the Constitution of the State of California. Original cost, \$1,000. Designed by Maj. G. S. Garnett, U. S. A., who declined to present it to the Convention for its adoption, but gave Mr. Caleb Lyons, of Lyonsdale, N. Y., who was then Assistant Secretary of the Convention, authority to present the same, and expressed a desire that he alone should be known as its author. The Seal is thus explained by its designer: "Around the bend of the ring are represented thirty-one stars, being the number of States of which the Union will consist upon the admission of California. The foreground figure represents the Goddess Minerva having sprung full grown from the brain of Jupiter. She is introduced as a type of political birth of the State of California, without having gone through the probation of a Territory. At her feet crouches a grizzly bear, feeding upon the clusters from a grapevine, emblematic of the country's peculiar characteristics. The sheaf of wheat and bunch of grapes were adopted as emblems of the Agricultural and Horticultural interests of the State. A miner is engaged, with his rocker and bowl at his side, illustrating the golden wealth of the Sacramento, upon whose waters are seen shipping typical of commercial greatness; and the snow-clad peaks of the Sierra Nevada make up the background, while above is the Greek motto, 'Eureka' (I have found it), applying either to the principle involved in the admission of the State, or the success of the miner at work."

Upon resolution offered by Hon. Myron Norton, the words "The Great Seal of the State of California" were added to the design.

MAJOR R. S. GARNETT died July 15, 1861. CALLEB LYONS died at Lyonsdale, New York, September 9, 1875.

The STATE CAPITOL, at Sacramento, Cal.—Corner Stone laid in the year 1850. Completed in 1874. Height, 240 feet; length, 382 feet; width, 128 feet. Senate Chamber, 56x69, 48 feet high. Assembly Chamber, 76x69, 48 feet high. Sixty rooms. Cost, \$2,500,000.
