The Program for Cooperative Cataloging Policy Committee (PCC PoCo) includes at-large representatives elected from active full, associate, and funnel level PCC institutions. The three-year terms of the 2019 elected members run from October 1, 2019 to September 30, 2020.

Three positions are open for the October 1, 2019 to September 30, 2020 term.

Instructions:

1. The PCC election will open May 29, 2019 and will end Friday June 14, 2019 at midnight (EDT).
2. Designated voters or their delegated representative must cast their vote using the PCC Directory account assigned to each institution.
3. Directors (or equivalent officer) of voting PCC institutional members may delegate voting rights to another person from their institution (e.g. the institution's BIBCO, CONSER, NACO, or SACO representative) but cannot give their right to vote to someone who already has voting rights due to their own role in the PCC (e.g. a PCC funnel coordinator).
4. Funnel coordinators, please cast a single ballot on behalf of the members of the funnel you coordinate.
5. Please review the candidate biographies and cast your vote.

At the same time, I have a thorough understanding and appreciation for the metadata policies and products that we currently use. I understand the compromises we need to make at times in terms of providing metadata. For example, I work with less frequently collected languages, such as Tamil, and Burmese; and I have to make decisions as to what level of cataloging we can provide. In other words, I have a good grasp of both the practical aspects of cataloging and the managerial aspects.

I'll close by adding that almost every single day I consult a PCC document. I am very proud to be part of a cooperative that supports its membership in such a positive and direct way. I would very much welcome the opportunity to serve the PCC, and to bring a pragmatic, and optimistic view to the table.
