

MARC 046 (Special Coded Dates) subfields for Corporate Bodies and Conferences

- In a NACO authority record for a corporate body, use 046 subfields \$q (Establishment date) and/or subfield \$r (Termination date) when recording the Date of Establishment (RDA 11.4.3) or the Date of Termination (RDA 11.4.4)
- In a NACO authority record for a corporate body, use 046 subfields \$s (Start period) and \$t (End period) when recording Period of Activity of Corporate Body (RDA 11.4.5)
- In a NACO authority record for a one-time conference, etc., or a single instance of a series of conferences (RDA 11.13.1.8.1), use 046 subfields \$s (Start period) and \$t (End period) when recording dates associated with the conference (RDA 11.4.2)
- In a NACO authority record for a collective conference (LC-PCC PS 11.13.1.8), use subfield \$q (Establishment date) and/or subfield \$r (Termination date) when recording the Date of Establishment (RDA 11.4.3), and/or the Date of Termination (RDA 11.4.4), for the overall series of conferences, if that information is known
