

Bio-bibliography H 1328

BACKGROUND: *The free-floating form subdivision –Bio-bibliography is assigned to works that contain both biographical information about authors and lists of books, articles, etc., written by them. This instruction sheet provides guidelines for using the subdivision –Bio-bibliography.*

1. General. Use the free-floating form subdivision **–Bio-bibliography** under names of places, names of individual Christian denominations or monastic and religious orders, literatures, including individual genres, ethnic groups, and topical headings, for works containing both biographical information about persons associated with the topic in question and bibliographies of writings by and/or about them. *Example:*

Title: The pro football bio-bibliography.
650 #0 \$a Football \$v Bio-bibliography.

Do not use **–Bio-bibliography** under classes of persons, unless a heading for the corresponding subject area does not exist and cannot be established.

Use **–Bio-bibliography** only for works that cover more than one person, not for bio-bibliographies of a single individual. For the latter type of work, assign separate headings to cover the biographical and bibliographical aspects of the work. *Example:*

Title: Spencer Tracy : a bio-bibliography.
600 10 \$a Tracy, Spencer, †d 1900-1967.
600 10 \$a Tracy, Spencer, †d 1900-1967 \$v Bibliography.
650 #0 \$a Motion picture actors and actresses \$v Biography.

2. Dictionaries. For bio-bibliographies arranged in dictionary format, use **–Bio-bibliography–Dictionaries** and subdivide further by language, if appropriate, in accordance with H 1540.
