

Seize the Feed: Content Syndication for Enhanced Governmental Information Services



RSS is an XML format which enables the syndication, or sharing, of Web content. Through a Web feed, new and updated content is sent automatically to subscribed users, thus significantly reducing the need to revisit sites individually.
