## **About the Keynote Speaker**

Sibyl E. Moses is a reference specialist in African American History and Culture in the Humanities and Social Sciences Division of the Library of Congress, Washington, D.C. She is also the author of the widely acclaimed reference book, *African American Women Writers in New Jersey*. Moses is a graduate of Spelman College in Atlanta, Georgia and earned a master's degree in Library and Information Science and Ph.D. at the University of Illinois, Urbana-Champaign. She was an Assistant Professor and later, Associate Professor, in the Graduate School of Library and Information Science, The Catholic University of America, Washington, D.C.

She was also director of the Office of Library Outreach Services at The American Library Association, Chicago, Illinois, and was the project archivist for the Phelps Stokes Fund Records in the Rare Books, Manuscripts, and Archives Section of The New York Public Library's Schomburg Center for Research in Black Culture.

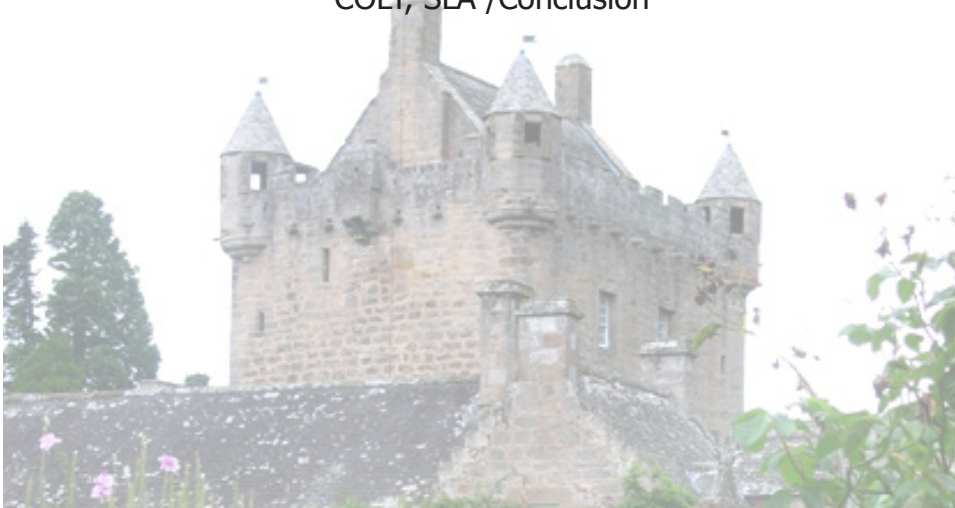
