### ***Law of Indigenous Peoples in the Americas***

Class KIA-KIX, the *Law of Indigenous Peoples in the Americas*, was added to the Library of Congress Law Classification (Class K) in 2013. The purpose of the new classification schedule is to provide for the first time a geopolitical and substantive arrangement for the Indigenous populations in the Americas, their organization, and the unique and complex body of legal sources. It was conceived as a distinct regional comparative and uniform law component of the existing classification for Law of the Americas (Class KDZ, KG-KH), completing the law classification development for this region under the expanded class letters KDZ- KIX.
