NLS to pilot braille eReader

For the past four years, NLS had been steadily working toward providing braille eReaders to its patrons. Historically the only options for patrons who wanted to read books in braille have been to receive the books in hardcopy through the mail, or to purchase a third-party braille display for reading electronic braille files downloaded from BARD—an expense many could not afford.

Soon, there will be a third option. This summer NLS will launch the pilot of the NLS Braille eReader. This is a 20-cell braille display, which will be provided to participating NLS patrons to read BRF files. Other features of the eReader include Bluetooth and Wi-Fi capability, a USB port, and SD-card storage access. Patrons will have the option to either download books from BARD to the device or order BRF books on USB cartridge from their network library. The pilot will start with four libraries and will solicit feedback on all aspects of the pilot devices from participating patrons. Stay tuned for more information regarding this exciting news.

Minibibliographies available

Looking for books on specific topics? NLS offers a wide variety of minibibliographies on

its website at <https://go.usa.gov/xdBbf>. The latest addition, “Rosa Parks (1913–2005),” highlights books on the pioneering civil rights activist and was released in conjunction with a Library of Congress exhibit showcasing Parks’s personal papers. Other minibibliographies cover subjects from baseball and gardening to financial planning and decluttering, and all provide direct links for downloading every listed title from BARD.

New Yorker now available in audio

The *New Yorker*, a weekly magazine that mixes journalism and essays with fiction and poetry, will return to the list of magazines available in audio from NLS in February 2020. Patrons interested in reading it can download it from BARD or contact their local cooperating network library to subscribe.

Magazines of the Month

The word "some" before any of these terms indicates an occasional or infrequent occurrence, as in "some strong language." Commercial audiobooks for which NLS does not have access to the print book may display the notice "unrated," which means that the book may or may not contain violence, strong language, or descriptions of sex.
