

CONTROL COUNCILLAW NO. 55Repeal of Certain Provisions of Criminal Legislation

THE CONTROL COUNCIL ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

ARTICLE I

The following laws are hereby expressly repealed together with all supplementary and explanatory laws, ordinances, and decrees:-

- (2) Ordinance of the Reich Minister of the Interior Prohibiting Communist Demonstrations in the Free State of Saxony (Verordnung des Reichsministers des Innern ueber das Verbot Kommunistischer Demonstrationen im Freistaat Sachsen) of 21 February 1933 (RGBl.I, 78);

ARTICLE II

Nothing in this Law shall revive any legislation which was abrogated by any provision or enactment repealed by this Law.

ARTICLE III

This Law shall come into force on 25 June 1947.

CONTROL COUNCILDIRECTIVE NO. 54Basic Principles for Democratization of Education in Germany

The Control Council approves the following principles and transmits them to the Zone Commanders and to the Allied Kommandatura, Berlin, for their guidance:

1. These should be equal educational opportunity for all.
2. Tuition, textbooks and other necessary scholastic material should be provided free of charge in all educational institutions fully supported by public funds which cater mainly for pupils of compulsory school age; in addition, maintenance grants should be made to those who need aid. In all other educational institutions, including universities, tuition, textbooks, and necessary material should be provided free of charge together with maintenance grants for those in need of assistance.
3. Compulsory full-time school attendance should be required for all between the ages of six and at least fifteen - and thereafter, for those pupils not enrolled in full-time educational institutions, at least pari-time compulsory attendance up to the completed age of eighteen years.
4. Schools for the compulsory periods should form a comprehensive educational system. The terms "elementary education" and "secondary education" should mean two consecutive levels of instruction, not two types or qualities of instruction which overlap.
5. All schools should lay emphasis upon education for civic responsibility and a democratic way of life, by means of the content of the curriculum, textbooks and materials of instruction, and by the organization of the school itself.
6. School curricula should aim to promote understanding of and respect for other nations and to this end attention should be given to the study of modern languages without prejudice to any.
7. Educational and vocational guidance should be provided for all pupils and students.
8. Health supervision and health education should be provided for all pupils and students. Instruction will also be given in Hygiene.

9. All teacher education should take place in a university or in a pedagogical institution of university rank.

10. Full provision should be made for effective participation of the people in the reform and organization as well as in the administration of the educational system.

CONTROL COUNCILDIRECTIVE NO. 55INTERZONAL EXCHANGE OF PRINTED MATTER AND FILMS

1. In accordance with the decision of the Council of Foreign Ministers at Moscow to facilitate further development of the democratic German press, and in order to establish in all of Germany a free exchange of information and democratic ideas, the Allied Control Authority authorizes the free exchange of newspapers, magazines, periodicals, films and books published in the different zones of occupation and in Berlin.

2. This exchange shall not be limited by Zone Commanders except by the requirements of military security, the needs of the occupation, the necessity of ensuring that Germany carries out her obligations to the Allies and the necessity of preventing a resurgence of national socialism and militarism. Each Zone Commander will retain the right to take such measures as he may deem necessary against any publications or any persons who violate these provisions, subsequently informing the Allied Control Authority of his action; he shall in addition have the right if he so chooses, to raise the question of the application of such measures before the appropriate body of the Allied Control Authority - the Information Committee of the Political Directorate.

3. This exchange of information and democratic ideas shall not be subject to any pressure of any sort, administrative or economic, on the part of the Central Government or Land Governments.

DRAFT INSTRUCTION BY THE POLITICAL DIRECTORATE TO THE INFORMATION  
COMMITTEE FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE DIRECTIVE RELATING TO THE  
INTERZONAL EXCHANGE OF NEWSPAPERS AND FILMS

In order to ensure the full implementation of Directive No. 55 the Information Committee shall, if requested by one of its members, promptly institute quadripartite investigation of any alleged interference with the free exchange of information and democratic ideas in Germany. A report of the investigation shall be forwarded to the Political Directorate in case of disagreement over the alleged violation and corrective action to be taken.

COORDINATING COMMITTEEEconomic Directorate Memorandum Concerning  
Reciprocal Deliveries

(Note by the Allied Secretariat)

1. At its 99th Meeting on 16 January 1947 the Coordinating Committee considered a paper on the above subject and agreed, in the terms of Conclusion (31) of CORC/M(47)3, to refer the paper to the Economic Directorate for examination in the light of the discussion and to instruct this Directorate to submit its plan to the Committee.

2. At its 98th, 99th, and 100th Meetings, the Economic Directorate examined a report of the Working Party on Reciprocal Deliveries and agreed to submit the following decisions to the Coordinating Committee for approval:

- (a) that the right to reciprocal deliveries accrues at the time of completion of the loading of capital reparations equipment on board Soviet ship or of the crossing of the demarcation line of the Soviet Zone;
- (b) that the Soviet Union becomes liable to make reciprocal deliveries up to 60% of the residual value of individual items (as in the inventory evaluation sheets) of capital equipment loaded on board Soviet ship or crossing the Soviet Zonal demarcation line, such value to be computed at the end of each quarter;
- (c) that bills of lading and inventory evaluation sheets should be accepted in determining the value of reciprocal deliveries due from the Soviet Union;
- (d) that copies of the bills of lading should be furnished to the respective Zone Commanders and the right of inspecting loading progress accorded them.
- (e) that reciprocal deliveries, the right to which accrued before 2 February 1947, will be made by the Soviet Union as follows:-
  - 1) 25% of the total shall be delivered within three months following the receipt of an agreed list of items to be delivered and agreement on the commercial terms of their delivery.

2) The remaining 75% shall be delivered in equal quarterly instalments after the period set out for the delivery of the first instalment, as in (1) above, and ending 2 November 1950;

- (f) that reciprocal deliveries the right to which accrued after 2 February 1947 and up to 2 February 1948 shall be made by the Soviet Union in equal quarterly instalments over the balance of the period ending 2 November 1950, the deliveries to commence in the quarter immediately following that in which they accrued;
- (g) that reciprocal deliveries the right to which accrues after 2 February 1948 would be a matter for further consideration in the light of subsequent decisions of the Allied Control Authority as to deliveries of capital equipment for reparations after that date.

3. The U.S., Soviet, and French Members wished to recommend to the Coordinating Committee that the Reparations, Deliveries, and Restitution Directorate should assume responsibility for reciprocal deliveries and related questions.

The British member stated that although he considered that the responsibility for reciprocal deliveries should eventually be transferred to the Reparations, Deliveries, and Restitution Directorate, he was of the opinion that such a transfer at the present time would be premature. There were still, at least, two important questions of principle which should be settled by the Economic Directorate, namely:

- (a) the principles by which place of delivery for any consignment shall be determined, and
- (b) the principles by which the 1938 price for any consignment shall be established.

The U.S., Soviet, and French Members were of the opinion that these questions were practical matters and not questions of principle, as the Economic Directorate had already agreed the principles. They were of the opinion, moreover, that the time had now come for the responsibility for reciprocal deliveries to be transferred to the Reparations, Deliveries, and Restitution Directorate.

326. MEMORANDUM FROM THE ECONOMIC DIRECTORATE ON  
RECIPROCAL DELIVERIES

The Meeting considered CORC/P(46)403/2.

THE MEETING:

- (326) (a) approved the recommendations of the Economic Directorate in paragraph 2 of CORC/P(46)403/2;
- (b) agreed that the Reparations, Deliveries and Restitution Directorate should henceforward assume responsibility for reciprocal deliveries and questions related thereto;
- (c) instructed the Reparations, Deliveries and Restitution Directorate to study
- (i) the principles by which place of delivery for any consignment shall be determined, and
  - (ii) the principles by which the 1938 price for any consignment shall be established, and

to report its decisions to the Coordinating Committee on these two points.

COORDINATING COMMITTEE

Financing of Expenses Connected With the Servicing of  
Ships Entering German Ports for Reparations Freight

(Note by the Allied Secretariat)

1. At its 123rd Meeting on 30 May 1947, the Coordinating Committee considered CORC/P(47)120\*) regarding the above question, and its Appendix 'A'.

2. The Coordinating Committee approved the addition of the following text in paragraph 3 of Appendix 'A' CORC/P(47)120:

"Appropriate basis" shall be defined as the space occupied by reparations cargoes in proportion to the space occupied by other cargo".

3. Moreover, the Coordinating Committee, following a proposal of the Soviet Member relative to an addition to paragraph 2 (e), agreed to return the paper to the Transport Directorate for consideration of this proposal and for submission of recommendations to the Coordinating Committee (conclusion 283 (a) of CORC/M(47)27).

4. At its 51st Meeting on 9 June 1947, the Transport Directorate agreed on the following new wording:

Paragraph 2 (e) - "Fee of agent"\*\*)

Add the following:

"Taking into account that German Shipping Agencies are set up in all German ports and can be utilized for handling vessels arriving for reparations freight, it should be agreed that in individual cases, if a representative of the receiving country should wish to engage the services of Allied Shipping Agencies, these latter must be paid in currency acceptable to them."

\*\*\*) General DRATVIN proposed to amend the first sentence of paragraph 2 (e) as quoted in paragraph 4 of the paper as follows: "taking into account; that German shipping agencies are set up in all German ports and should be utilized . . .", it being understood that the countries concerned are nevertheless able to employ other shipping agencies, on condition that they pay them. (Note by the Allied Secretariat)

1. At its 66th Meeting the Finance Directorate approved a paper on the above subject, attached at Appendix A, agreed to forward it to the Transport Directorate for their comments, and requested the latter to transmit it direct to the Coordinating Committee.

2. The Transport Directorate examined the paper (Appendix A) at its 49th Meeting and agreed that the following clarifications should be included:-

Paragraph 2 (e) - "fee of agent"

Add the following:-

"German shipping agents are available in German ports. If Allied shipping agents are engaged, they must be paid in currency acceptable to them by the organization which engaged them".

Paragraph 3.

Add the following sentence:-

"'Appropriate basis' shall be defined as the space occupied by reparations cargoes in proportion to the space occupied by other cargo".

FINANCING OF EXPENSES CONNECTED WITH THE SERVICING OF SHIPS  
ENTERING GERMAN PORTS FOR REPARATIONS FREIGHT

1. Paragraph 14 of CORC/1(46)24 provides that the payment of all expenses for the transport of reparational freight up to the German border are to be borne By Germany.

2. For transport by sea, it is laid down that the following costs within Germany of ships calling in German ports, to the extent that they can be met by German internal resources shall, subject to any subsequent direction of the Allied Control Authority with regard to the allocation of these costs, be charged to the budget of the Land, Province or Zone from which the reparational equipment originates, i.e. -

- (a) transport to the port and loading on board (including the use of loading equipment, dockers and stevedores);
- (b) towing expenses;
- (c) piloting expenses;
- (d) port charges;
- (e) fee of agent.

These will apply so long as the expenditures are necessarily incidental to the removal of reparations, and provided that no expenditure authorized shall be of a capital nature.

3. In the case of mixed cargoes (reparations and others), proration of cargoes shall be made on an appropriate basis.

334. FINANCING OF EXPENSES CONNECTED WITH THE SERVICING OF SHIPS  
ENTERING GERMAN PORTS TO LOAD REPARATIONS FREIGHT

The Meeting considered CORC/P(47)120/1.

THE MEETING:

- (334) (a) approved CORC/P(47)120 in its entirety, including the amendment set out in CORC/P(47)120/1 and the amendment proposed by the Soviet Delegate;
- (b) instructed the Allied Secretariat to inform the Zone Commanders and the Allied Kommandatura of this document.

COORDINATING COMMITTEEAllocation of General Purpose Equipment from War Plants  
in the British Zone

(Note by the Allied Secretariat)

1. At its 85th Meeting on 24 October 1946 the Coordinating Committee instructed the Economic Directorate to proceed with the bulk allocation to the USSR and LRA of the general purpose equipment from war plants which were to be destroyed.
  2. In accordance with the above instruction the Economic Directorate, at its 99th Meeting on 14 May 1947, examined a list of war plants in the British Zone, the general purpose equipment of which was available for allocation.
  3. The Directorate agreed to submit the following decisions for the approval of the Coordinating Committee:
    - (a) Allocation to the Interallied Reparations Agency of the general purpose equipment specified in the list attached at Appendix 'A';
    - (b) That as the Interallied Reparations Agency had not had an opportunity to make bids for the general purpose equipment from the plants allocated, it should have the right to reject within a reasonable time any of these units of allocation.
  4. The British Delegation in submitting this list of general purpose equipment to the Economic Directorate pointed out that requests had been received from the Interallied Reparations Agency on behalf of the member nations for certain items of equipment which were urgently required by them to meet the needs of their industrial reconstruction programme. In accordance with a statement by the British Delegate in the Coordinating Committee (CORC/M(46)58 Appendix "A") some of these items had been earmarked unilaterally by the British Zone Commander from 47 of the plants included in the list. The remaining items were available for immediate allocation to the U.S.S.R. and to the Interallied Reparations Agency.
- The Economic Directorate took note of the Soviet memorandum attached as Appendix 'B' protesting against action by the British Zone Commander in undertaking unilateral allocation.

5. The Directorate also agreed, subject to the approval of the Coordinating Committee, to forward to the Reparations Deliveries and Restitution Directorate the list of plants for notification to the Interallied Reparations Agency.

6. The allocation of the above equipment is effected in conformity with CORC/M(46)56, Decision 604 (c); it is the fourth allocation of this kind.

THE MEETING:

- (331) (a) approved the allocation to the Inter-Allied Reparations Agency for reparations of the general purpose equipment listed at Appendix "A" of CORC/P(47)146, the Inter-Allied Reparations Agency have the right to reject any unit of allocation within a reasonable time.
- (b) instructed the Reparations, Deliveries and Restitution Directorate to notify the Inter-Allied Reparations Agency of the above decision.

CONTROL COUNCILLaw No. 56Repeal of the Law of 23 March 1934, on the Regulation  
of Labour in Public Administrations and Enterprises

THE CONTROL COUNCIL ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

ARTICLE I

The Law of 23 March 1934 on "The Regulation of Labour in Public Administrations and Enterprises" (Gesetz zur Ordnung der Arbeit in oeffentlichen Verwaltungen und Betrieben, RGBl.I, p.220), together with all supplementary and explanatory laws, ordinances, regulations and decrees, is hereby repealed.

ARTICLE II

Tariffs (Tarifordnungen) now in force shall continue *in force* until repealed, amended or otherwise revised by the appropriate authorities.

ARTICLE-III

This Law shall become effective on 4th July 1947.

Financing of Expenses Connected with the Servicing of Ships Entering  
German Ports for Reparations Freight

(Note by the Allied Secretariat)

1. Paragraph 14 of CORC/P(46)24 provides that the payment of all expenses for the transport of reparational freight up to the German border are to be borne by Germany.

2. For transport by sea, it is laid down that the following costs within Germany of ships calling in German ports, to the extent that they can be met by German internal resources shall, subject to any subsequent direction of the Allied Control Authority with regard to the allocation of these costs, be charged to the budget of the Land, Province or Zone from which the reparational equipment originates, i.e.-

- (a) transport to the port and loading on board (including the use of loading equipment, dockers and stevedores);
- (b) towing expenses;
- (c) piloting expenses;
- (d) port charges;
- (e) fee of agent

Taking into account that German Shipping Agencies are set up in all German ports and should be utilised for handling vessels arriving for reparations freight, it should be agreed that in individual cases, if a representative of the receiving country should wish to engage the services of Allied Shipping Agencies, these latter must be paid in currency acceptable to them.

These will apply so long as the expenditures are necessarily incidental to the removal of reparations, and provided that no expenditure authorized shall be of a capital nature.

3. In the case of mixed cargoes (reparations and others), proration of cargoes shall be made on an appropriate basis. 'Appropriate basis' shall be defined as the space occupied by reparations cargoes in proportion to the space occupied by other cargo.
