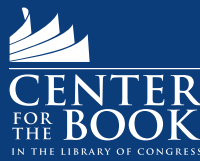


WELCOME TO THE 2010 NATIONAL BOOK FESTIVAL

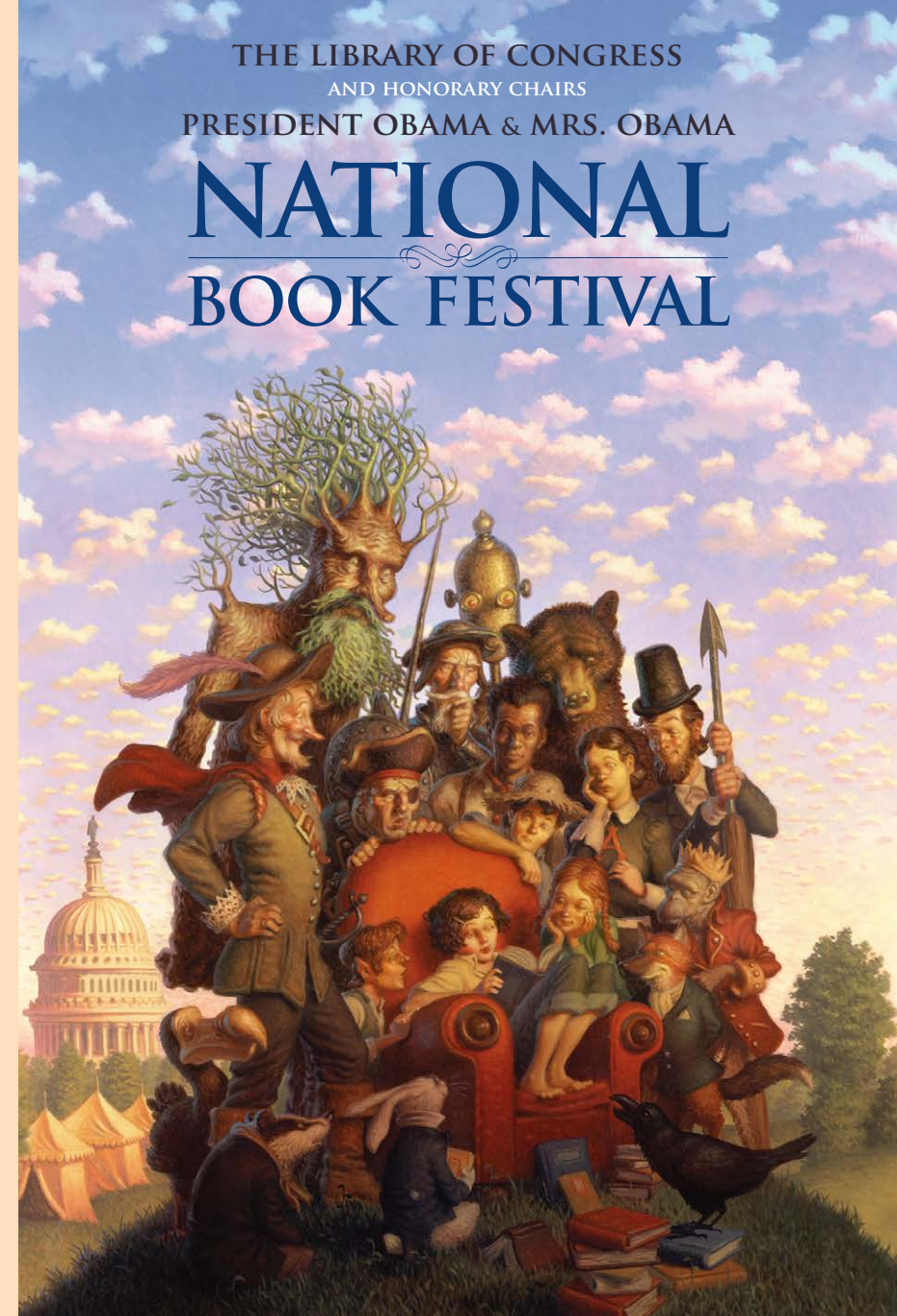
There is an affiliated Center for the Book in each state, the District of Columbia and the U.S. Virgin Islands. These centers spread the word throughout the land that "books give us wings."
