

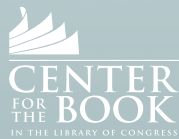
WELCOME TO THE 2015 NATIONAL BOOK FESTIVAL

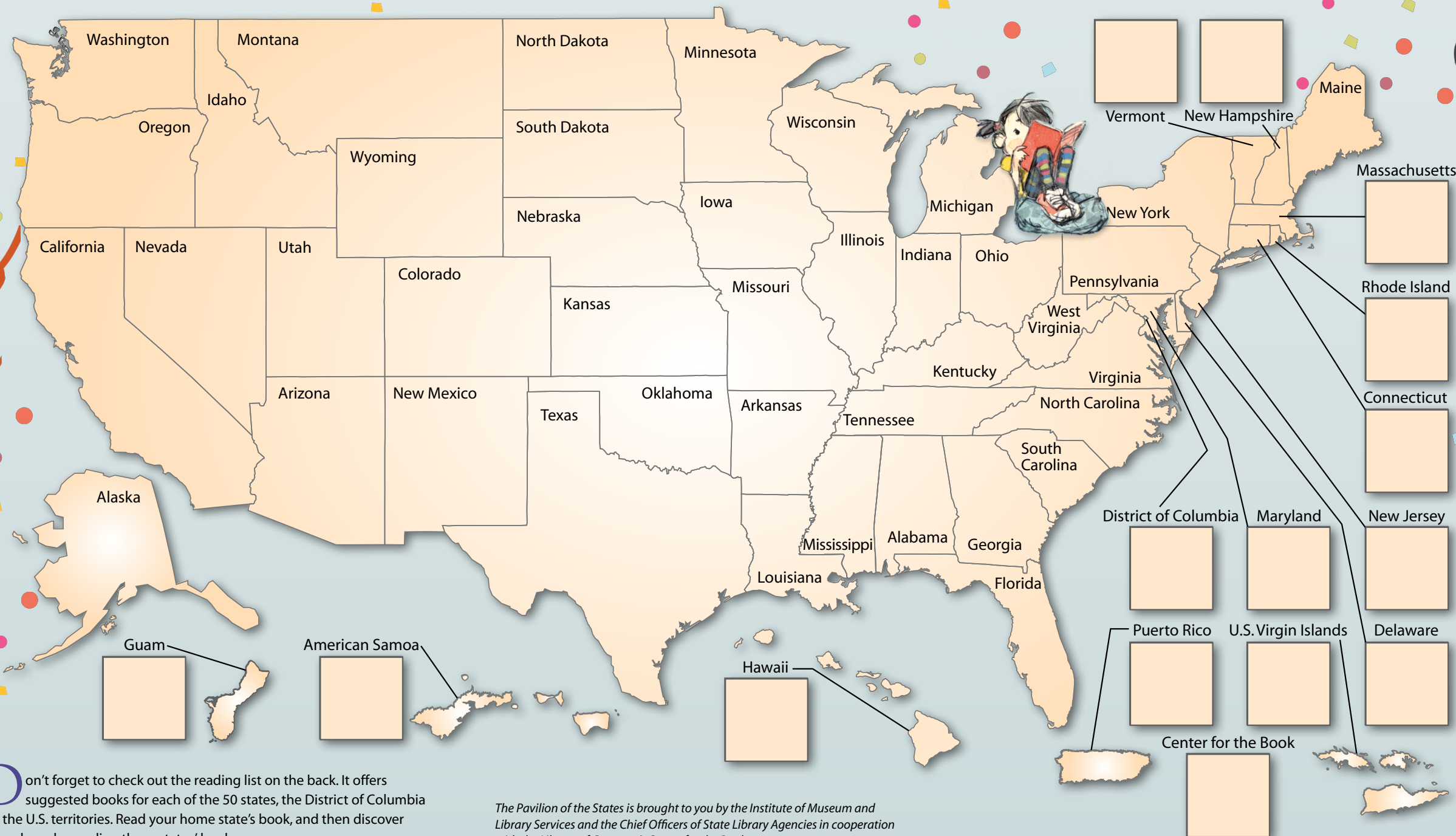
